** Prospective students wishing to pursue a degree in music must complete an audition prior to the deadline for which they are applying. Please contact the Department of Music and Fine Arts (724-458-2084 or eparnold@gcc.edu) for an audition in person or via audiotape.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT: The College may grant academic credit to incoming freshmen who have successfully completed Advanced Placement courses and achieved a score of 4 or 5 on the accompanying Advanced Placement Tests. The appropriate department chairman will determine whether a student with a score of 3 should be given advanced credit and placement. Credit is not given for scores of 1 or 2. Students who receive Advanced Placement credit in a subject will only receive credit at Grove City College if that same course is not taken here or at another college or university.

INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE PROGRAM: Grove City College recognizes the International Baccalaureate as a vigorous college preparatory program, and welcomes applications for admission from all interested students. Credit is generally awarded for the IB Higher level examination passed with grades of 5, 6 or 7. No credit is awarded for IB Standard examinations. IB credit may be applied to major programs with the approval of the appropriate academic department but may not be used to satisfy the Civilization Series requirements.

**** An interview is HIGHLY recommended for serious applicants who live within a day's drive of the campus. The half hour on-campus interview is conducted by an Admissions Counselor and becomes a significant portion of your application.**

APPLICATION FEE: A non-refundable application fee of \$50.00 must accompany the application. The application will not be processed until the fee is received.

ESSAYS: Applicants must complete the two essays listed on the back of the application.

RECOMMENDATIONS: All applicants should submit one academic letter of recommendation (ex: teacher or counselor) and one spiritual/character letter of recommendation (ex: pastor or youth pastor). Additional letters may be submitted; however, the number of recommendations received does not factor into the decision-making process. The College does not provide specific forms for the recommendation letters.

HOMESCHOOLING STUDENTS: Homeschoolers must follow the application instructions as outlined above, including the submission of some form of a transcript and an outline of extracurricular activities. The transcript should include the student's course of study and grades. Standardized test scores (SAT or ACT) must be sent from College Board. The required letters of recommendation should come from individuals outside the home. Small portfolios are welcome, but not required. An interview is strongly recommended. A homeschooled student who has enrolled full-time in college (12 or more credits in a semester) should apply as a transfer student.

FRESHMAN APPLICANTS:

Early Decision Program: Students who are prepared to make a binding commitment to Grove City College as their first choice school should apply under the early decision program. A student should not apply for early decision unless the student **fully** expects to accept an admission offer from GCC. This program requires the submission of the application and all supporting documents by a **postmark deadline of November 15**; decisions will be mailed on December 15. Students applying to Grove City under the early decision program should not apply to any other institution through its early decision program, although they are welcome to submit applications to other schools under the early action or regular decision programs. A student who has applied early decision agrees, upon acceptance, to withdraw applications to all other institutions and submit no additional applications. Students who require a financial aid estimate should contact our Financial Aid Office at (724) 458-3300 during the application process. Those who are not accepted for admission at Early Decision may be considered again with the Regular Decision applicant group, unless the student is denied admission. **Accepted students should reply by a postmark deadline of January 15, with the non-refundable payment of \$250.00.**

Regular Decision Program: For those students who are considering several colleges, or for students who are not prepared to make a commitment to Grove City at Early Decision, we recommend the Regular Decision program. Applicants seeking Regular Decision must submit the application and all supporting documents by a **postmark deadline of February 1** of the senior year; admissions decisions will be mailed on **March 15**. **Accepted students should reply by a postmark deadline of May 1, with the non-refundable payment of \$250.00. Applications received after the February 1 deadline will be considered late, and if acceptable, will be placed on a waiting list.**

TRANSFER APPLICANTS: A student who has attended another college, whether or not he/she is a candidate for advanced standing, must present an official high school transcript as well as a college transcript, and must have a minimum college cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale in order to be considered for enrollment. Transfer credits do not enter into the computation of a student's quality point average at the College, and may not exceed fifty percent of the total credits toward graduation. At a minimum, 64 credit hours of work is required to be completed at the College, as well as one half of all hours for any major, minor, certification or concentration. College credit is awarded to those students who have earned a "C" or better in courses that have been completed at a regionally accredited institution and approved by Grove City College for transfer. Transfer credit requests to apply toward the 18 hour "Civilization Series" (humanities core) will be reviewed on an individual basis by the Registrar; however, transfer students must take one humanities course each semester attended at the College. Spring semester applicants will be notified shortly after January 1 and fall semester applicants will be notified in mid-summer. Transfer students are accepted based upon available space in the residence halls and we recommend students apply to transfer in the spring semester. **The Mechanical Engr. program is not available to transfer students.**

ACCEPTANCE DEPOSIT: A payment of \$250.00 is required of all applicants at the time they accept admission to the College. This deposit is **non-refundable** if the applicant later decides not to enroll at the College during the year for which he/she was accepted.

Purpose and Identity of Grove City College

Since its founding in 1876, Grove City College, committed to Christian principles, has striven to be equal in academic quality to the finest four-year colleges. It seeks to provide liberal and professional education of the highest excellence in the reach of families with modest means who desire a college which will strengthen their children's spiritual and moral character.

When the college was chartered, a broad, Christian-based cultural consensus prevailed in America. By charter, the doors of the college were open to qualified students "without regard to religious test or belief."

The founders of Grove City College, consciously avoiding narrow sectarianism, held a vision of Christian society transcending denomination, creeds, and confessions. They were committed to the advancement of free enterprise, civil and religious liberty, representative government, arts and letters, and science and technology. Believing that the fruits of civilization would be destroyed if the religious and ethical roots were allowed to wither, the founders intended that the claims of Christ as God and Savior and of inspired Scripture be presented to all.

They hoped that through its program of intellectual, moral, and

spiritual education, Grove City College would produce young leaders, whatever their creed or confession, capable of pushing civilization forward on every frontier.

Grove City College remains true to the vision of its founders. Rejecting relativism and secularism, it fosters intellectual, moral, spiritual, and social development consistent with a commitment to Christian truth, morals, and freedom. Rather than political, ideological, or philosophical agendas, objective truth continues as the goal of liberal learning.

The core of the curriculum, particularly in the humanities, consists of books, thinkers, and ideas proven across the ages to be of value in the quest for knowledge. Intellectual inquiry remains open to the questions religion raises and affirms the answers Christianity offers.

The ethical absolutes of the Ten Commandments and Christ's moral teaching guide the effort to develop intellect and character in the classroom, chapel, and co-curricular activities. And while many points of view are examined, the college unapologetically advocates preservation of America's religious, political, and economic heritage of individual freedom and responsibility.
