Dear Students,

Housing selection for fall 2009 will begin shortly! Following is a timeline of this semester's housing process.

- **Monday, February 23rd** – Fall Housing Survey available on myGCC
- **Tuesday, February 24th** – Colonial Hall Applications due with \$200 deposit
- **Tuesday, March 3rd** – Apartment room draw numbers sent out
- **Thursday, March 5th** – Apartment room draw (7:00 p.m., Men; 8:00 p.m., Women) (TLC Auditorium)
- **Monday, March 23rd** – *All* students must have Fall Housing Survey completed
- **Monday, March 30th** – Email sent to all students confirming fall housing status
- **Friday, April 3rd** – Housing deposits (\$200) due by this date to participate in room draw
- **Monday, April 13th** – Room draw numbers emailed to all resident students
- **Monday, April 20th** – Male Room Draw (6:00 p.m.)
- **Tuesday, April 21st** – Female Room Draw (6:00 p.m.)

NOTE: Students with outstanding charges on their accounts, including an unpaid housing deposit, will not be able to register for fall classes nor participate in Room Draw.

Room Selection: Room Draw is scheduled for Monday, April 20th (Men) and Tuesday, April 21st (Women) in the IM Room. Random numbers for the lottery system will be distributed via email a week prior to the event. More information can be found on myGCC, under the “Student” tab. Students with super senior status are not eligible for campus housing.

Housing Deposit: A \$200 housing deposit is due according to the timeline above and may be paid online through CashNet on myGCC. A bill will be sent to you for this amount, and you are responsible for ensuring that payment is remitted. This deposit will be credited to your student account in July. It is not an increased cost, simply a partial prepayment of your fall room and board charge. Resident students will not be permitted to participate in Room Draw if this deposit is not paid. If you pay the deposit and later decide not to return to Grove City College in the fall, the full \$200 will be refunded if such written notification is received by Student Life and Learning no later than July 1. Any notification of voluntary withdrawal after July 1 will result in a forfeiture of the entire deposit.

Colonial Hall Housing Deposit: A \$200 housing deposit must be submitted with your application to live in Colonial Hall. If you withdraw from the College after July 1, 2008, you will forfeit 100% of this amount to the College (\$200).

Changing Status: To change housing status from resident to commuter you must complete the permission form available in the Student Life & Learning office. If you plan to voluntarily withdraw or transfer from the College at the end of the spring semester, you must notify Mrs. Neiswonger in Enrollment Services (Financial Aid Office). **Please note:** A change in your housing status may affect the status of your financial aid, either from the College or from external sources.
