Grove City honored as ‘All-American College’

GROVE CITY, Pa. – The Intercollegiate Studies Institute has recommended Grove City College as one of 50 “All-American Colleges,” and included the College in the publication, “All-American Colleges: Top Schools for Conservatives, Old-Fashioned Liberals, and People of Faith.”

ISI highly recommends the College as a school with programs tied to the “core values of the American founding and the vibrant intellectual traditions of the West.” Grove City’s commitment to exposing its students to Western civilization and its strong humanities core and general education requirements distinguish it from other liberal art colleges, according to a release from ISI.

“Grove City College continues to uphold its founding commitment to a vision of objective truth and liberal learning, and it strives to remain committed to Christian principles,” reads an excerpt from the college guide. “The school is openly committed to defending traditional Christianity and the American political and economic systems.”

The profile of the College is based on “extensive interviews” with administrators, faculty and students. The “All-American Colleges” guide will be available nationwide later this month. ISI considered hundreds of schools for its publication.

Grove City College is listed as one of the Most Competitive colleges in the nation by Barron’s. In its category, Grove City College is also ranked by U.S. News & World Report as the No. 1 Best Value and remains in the top ten overall for best colleges in the region in the 2007 guide to America’s Best Colleges. Kaplan has also called Grove City College a “best value” and a “hidden treasure” and Grove City College is a Princeton Review Best Bargain school. Founded in 1876, it is located 60 miles north of Pittsburgh, Pa. With an enrollment of 2,450 students, it is a private Christian college teaching the liberal arts, sciences and engineering. It is an advocate of the free market economic system and accepts no federal funding. Tuition is about half of the national average for private colleges.
