The Grove City College BEST Robotics Competition, which is a national robot competition ([www.bestinc.org](http://www.bestinc.org)) for high school and middle school students, will be held at the College this October. Dr. Mike Bright began this particular BEST Hub here at the College in 2010, which has provided students from both local schools and those in the Erie and Pittsburgh regions with exposure to engineering and science through a hands-on experience. Like many events, the competition is in need of volunteer participation. The volunteers are crucial as they help to make the program run smoothly.

We will mostly need volunteers on Friday evening and Saturday morning of competition weekend. They will judge various aspects, referee the game, and generally manage the crowd (we have about 14 teams with approximately 300 students in addition to their families and friends). **Be assured, reading and writing are the only skills necessary for volunteering, so everyone is welcome.** This is a great way to be involved with Grove City College and a great competition, volunteer alongside some phenomenal individuals, and play a role in the lives of local young people who may want to pursue engineering in the future.
