

JUNIOR

Seek leadership opportunities within pre-health organizations on campus.

Investigate paid or volunteer med experience for gap year.

Investigate medical schools, and consider a timeline so you can submit applications as they open.

Consider faculty and mentors to write recommendations for you.

Serve as a teaching assistant.

SENIOR

Seek leadership opportunities within pre-health organizations on campus.

Continue med school research.

Register to take the standardized tests for the field of your choice, if you have not already.

Serve as a teaching assistant.

Graduate from Grove City College on time!

GAP/BRIDGE YEAR

Seek meaningful employment, education, or experience to fulfill clinical hours for your field of choice.

Reduce credit card and undergraduate debt.

Interview for and tour medical schools before selecting one.

SUMMER 3

Investigate medical schools, and consider a timeline so you can submit applications as they open.

Register to take the standardized tests for the field of your choice.

Work/volunteer in the field of your choice, prioritize earning clinical hours.

Ask for recommendation letters from trusted faculty.

SUMMER 4

Complete med school applications.

Work/volunteer in the field of your choice, prioritize earning clinical hours.
