Application deadlines are one week before the first day of class. Grove City Colleg accommodate applications and documents received after the due dates but canno semester.	•
The student will be unable to register for any Grove City College classes until ALL required admissions documents are received and admission is confirmed. Notification of admission will be sent by mail to the address provided on the student's application.	
Payment must be made in full before the student is permitted to attended class.	
Once admitted, communication to the student regarding college matters will take place via use of his/her college email address.	
The Dual Enrolled program allows a high school student early access to the collegiate experience, which may be very different from the high school environment. Grove City College will consider each participant a college student, and all rules, regulations, policies and procedures will apply exactly as they would apply to any other student at Grove City College.	
A wide array of topics and ideas may be discussed from a mature point of view in the classroom.	
High school students taking college courses are bound by the rules of Academic Integrity as outlined in the Grove City College student handbook.	
Parents are not permitted to attend a class in which their student is enrolled.	
Dual Enrolled students live at home and are typically under the age of 18; therefore, their medical care should be provided by their family physician. In the event of a medical emergency on campus, students should call 724-458-3000, with Campus Safety serving as the College's first responder. Campus Safety will provide initial emergency care, with outside emergency services being dispatched through their department for emergency transport and ongoing care, if needed. The student's parents will be contacted as soon as possible in the event of a medical emergency.	
Dual Enrolled students with underlying chronic medical conditions or medical problems which may lend themselves to a medical emergency should contact the Academic Resource Center located in Crawford Hall to determine whether there is a need for accommodations. Whenever possible, this contact should take place prior to the start of classes.	
Grove City College may communicate course progress including grades to school counselors. Parents may obtain those progress reports through the school counselors.
