TAKE THE STRESS OUT OF PAYING FOR COLLEGE — MAKE A PLAN!

We understand that paying for college can be a daunting prospect. We want to help! This workbook is designed to help you take the stress out of paying for college by laying out the many funding options available to you. We hope that this will be a valuable resource to you as you develop a plan to make your Grove City College education a reality.





NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

The first option to consider is need-based financial aid. **There is no magic income number that is the cutoff between qualifying and not qualifying for financial aid**, so you should apply no matter your family's income level. The application opens on October 1 and **the deadline is April 15**. You can access the CSS Profile at gcc.edu/financialaid.

NEXT STEPS

- COMPLETE THE CSS PROFILE.
- SUBMIT W2S AND TAX RETURNS.

IMPORTANT: We do not use the FAFSA. To apply for need-based financial aid, you must complete the CSS Profile.

MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIPS FROM GROVE CITY COLLEGE

NEXT STEPS

- APPLY FOR ADMISSION.
- COMPLETE THE TRUSTEE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION.
- SUBMIT STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES AND HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT FOR MERIT SCHOLARSHIP CONSIDERATION.

Second, you can apply for our merit-based scholarships. Grove City's competitive **Trustee Scholarship** program offers scholarships ranging from half tuition to full tuition with food and housing.

Our **President's Scholarship** (\$7,500 renewable) and **Provost's Scholarship** (\$4,000 renewable) are available to students who apply for admission by Jan. 31 and meet certain GPA and test score requirements.

Our **Alumni Merit Reward Scholarship** (AMRS) is offered to eligible incoming freshmen each year, for as much as \$4,000 your freshman year (non-renewable scholarship).

NOTE: There are also GPA-based scholarships and department-based scholarships available once you've enrolled.

STATE GRANTS

Third, you should always apply for state grants. While Grove City College does not accept any federally funded grants, we do accept state aid, and some states — even outside of Pennsylvania — allow you to use state grants to attend Grove City! This means that you should always **fill out the FAFSA to apply for state grants**, even if you do not live in Pennsylvania.

Check with your high school guidance office or your state's Higher Education Assistance Agency to see what grants are available to you.

PRIVATE OUTSIDE SCHOLARSHIPS

Next, take the time to search for outside scholarships. This may be much more important than you realize because Grove City College students are very successful in winning outside scholarships. There are thousands of scholarships available through private organizations, endowments, and community foundations. **Those Grove City students who earn scholarships bring in an average of \$5,283 each in outside scholarship money**, so don't overlook this option. TAKING OUT STUDENT LOANS

Next, if you are considering taking out a loan to help pay for school, be sure to do your research and work with your parents or other financial advisors to find the best rate for you — most banks and lending companies offer student loans. **Some private organizations even offer interest free student loan programs for residents of certain counties**, such as Stark County, OH; Mercer County, PA; and Lancaster County, PA. So be sure to investigate to see if these are available where you live. Just be sure that the loan you choose is private, and not federally funded (Grove City College operates independently of the federal government, and therefore, does not accept federal funding).

- CALCULATE THE TOTAL INTEREST AND TIME IT WILL REQUIRE TO PAY BACK YOUR LOAN.


MORE IDEAS TO CONSIDER...
